

Cookie Policy

Cookies are small packets of information that are stored by your web browser. They are put on your web browser by the websites that you visit. These packets of information do not contain personal information about you, but they do allow us to know if you visit the same website twice or if you visit related websites.

The laws in the United States may require you to provide a form of consent before cookies are placed on your web browser unless the cookie is necessary for the website to work.

There is no agreed standard for how companies comply with these laws. We do the following:

- We only use cookies where they are necessary for our services or where you have provided your express or implied consent.
- We respect your wishes, and you can inspect, delete, or block any cookies used by us by selecting the appropriate control in your web browser.
- We support technologies that have been developed and are being developed for your web browser that allows you to be more selective about the cookies that your web browser will accept.

When you visit our websites, a cookie (a very small text file) is placed on your machine (if it is accepted); this is to provide you with a personalized experience and to assist in the collection of the site visitation statistics. You may refuse the cookie if you wish. To do so, you will need to check your browser settings.

ARC collects certain information about your computer hardware and software, this includes (however is not limited to):

- Your IP address
- Browser type
- Operating system
- Access times
- Referring website addresses

This information is used for the operation of the service, to maintain quality of the service, and to provide general statistics regarding use of ARC's websites. If you choose to not allow your browser to accept cookies, your viewing experience should not be affected.

ARC uses cookies to identify you and your interests and to track your use of the Site. We also use cookies to control access to certain content on our Site and to process any requests that you make with us.

To administer our website and for research purposes, ARC has also contracted with third parties to track and analyze anonymous usage and volume statistical information from our visitors and members. Such information is shared externally only on an anonymous, aggregated basis. These third parties use persistent cookies to help us to improve the visitor experience, manage our site content, and track visitor behavior.

ARC has also contracted with a third party to send e-mail to our registered members. To help measure and improve the effectiveness of our e-mail communications, the third-party sets cookies. All data collected by this third party on behalf of ARC is used solely by or on behalf of ARC and is shared externally only on an anonymous, aggregated basis.
